# Minutes of the JAN. Meeting

#### January 18, 20 21

The meeting was called to order at 10:00 a.m.

Thought for the Day by Laura Ingalls Wilder: "The real things haven't changed. It is still best to be honest and truthful; to make the most of what we have; to be happy with simple pleasures; and have courage when things go wrong."

#### Treasurer, Ellen Cannon

- Current balance is \$13,500.18.
- Jill Kelly made a motion to continue paying the church \$3,000 annually in rent versus reducing that amount to \$2,500.

Motion was seconded by MaryAnn Dennis, and passed with majority vote from the membership.

#### Ways and Means, Ellen Cannon

- There will be a sewing room sale before and after the April guild meeting, and if necessary, it will be outside in front of the church.

Auditing Committee, Sherry Verell- An auditing committee meeting is to be held later in the day on January 18.

#### President Pat Delia

• Apologized for the scam emails appearing to be from her, but are really fake emails using her name. She is researching how to stop the fake emails, but at this time, does not know how to stop them. The fake emails are only being sent to guild members, and not her family.

• Job descriptions were given to new board members.

#### Vice President, Linda Wilson

• As far as she knows, the **Fall Retreat** is still scheduled for October 25 to 29 in Ocala. The theme will be "Sew Spooky", and cost is \$270.

• **QuiltFest** is canceled for 2021. AQS has canceled all of their shows for 2021. The next QuiltFest will be in March of 2022. Issues currently being discussed for QuiltFest are: change of venue; vendor recruitment, publicity, and better attendance.

#### Recording Secretary/Quilts of Valor, Linda Marsh

- · Nothing to report on Recording Secretary duties
- 25 completed quilts were just donated from Sunshine State Quilters of Florida. QOV presentations are slow due to Covid 19; however, has one presentation scheduled for tomorrow.

#### Spring Retreat, Ellen Cannon


So, here we go into 2021. Time to make more Community Service quilts, finish some UFO'S, participate in classes, and attend meetings (in person or on Zoom).

# **Programs coming up**

#### February 15 - "Quilters' Potpourri"

Several Guild members will present quilting ideas, hints, lessons learned and potential projects. One presentation will include the surprising history of a common fabric.

**March 15** – Presentation by Danisse from Miss D's in Palatka

Danisse will discuss the differences between print and digital fabric and will include examples of both types of fabric. She will also discuss how fabric production is scheduled, when designers start designing to meet production schedules and how inventory is managed. This may be of help to those of us who see a quilt in a magazine and find that the fabric used in the quilt is no longer in print.

April 19 - Presentation by Kathy Metalica Cray

Robyn, who lives in Michigan, is Kathi Thompson's daughter, and she has presented to the Guild before. She also will teach a class in the afternoon after the Guild meeting.

Other programs in the works include the reveal of the 2020/2021 Challenge Quilts (Pick-A-Card), presentations by the 12 x 12 groups, a program, subject to be determined, presented by Sunnie Malesky, and the sewing room auction with Bruce from Scrappy Rooster in Kingsland, GA, acting as our auctioneer.

This light maple colored cabinet is ideal for cutting fabric and storing quilting/sewing tools, patterns, fabric and other items. Closed, the piece measures 46.5" W x 21" D x 34.5" H. ## **BOM INFO**

Our 12 BOMs will all go together in a quilt, if you decide to use them that way.

The value/shading in the block picture is mostly so you can see the different pieces clearly...have fun changing the values and colors as you like!

Due to their diagonal designs, it is often necessary to use a very scant seam allowance. Some blocks have larger outside triangles so you can trim to correct size. This is usually noted in the block pattern instructions.

FUDGE FACTOR: this goes for any block!...as long as you have 1/8 inch for seam allowance you can still sew two pieces together.

Mark the section that is "shy" and do not line it up with the other piece's edge. Use the piece with full seam allowance as the edge to guide your sewing.

## **FEBRUARY BOM**

King's Crown


12" finished

### CUTTING

- A) Corner squares: 4-3 1/2"
- B) Geese Background (small triangles) : 4—squares 3 7/8" then cut in half on diagonal for 8 triangles.

C) Geese bodies (large triangles) : 1 square 7 1/4 cut twice on diagonal like an X (makes 4 large triangles)

D) Center Square: 6 1/2"



Sew a Flying Goose (make 4 total) by sewing 2 Bs (long sides) to a C (short sides).

Be sure to press the first B into place and trim "dog ear" before sewing the second one.

Sew one Geese unit to opposite sides of D.

Sew an A to the short sides of 2 of the other 2 Geese.

Sew the A/ Geese units to the D/ Geese unit.

If you are using directional fabric, you may want to lay out all the pieces before you sew.

**Alternate method**: Sew the long side of a C on opposite sides of D, then the remaining 2 sides.

Sew a B short side on 2 adjoining sides of each A. Make 4!

Sew these big triangle units to the C/D center, on 2 opposite sides then the remaining 2 sides.

### **OR** Sew & Flip Geese:

8-3 7/8" squares and 4-3 7/8 x 6 1/2" rectangles

Mark a diagonal sewing line on each 3 7/8" square.

Place on end of rectangle with line running to the C side center. Sew & press up into corner...trim out extra layers if desired. Finish one side (sew—trim—press) before sewing the other.

Complete the block. Unfinished it should be 12 1/2".
