

HISTORIAN

Excerpt from a newsletter article in 1994 :

Arpilleras is a form of applique made by Chilean women. Prior to the transition to democracy, starting in the 1980's, one of the few political statements allowed for women was through their applique "quilts". Poverty was a painful legacy for millions of families. There is now democracy however many women are still making and selling the arpilleras (made from recycled cloth) to help support their families.

Further info from the William Benton Museum of Art:

It's clear that the arpilleristas of Chile ultimately learned the delights of creating art. As these oppressed women turned to sewing for solace and income, they grew more self-confident, thoughtful, and independent, and learned of the pleasure to be found in color, texture, shape and form. By telling their painful stories fearlessly and truthfully, they became citizens of a world larger than anything they or their mothers had ever known. It is no wonder that their arpilleras have been called "the revolutionary banners of modern Chile."

New Product Review: FABRIC FUSE

I sent Mindy an email and told her about a new product I just used putting a quilt sandwich together. She suggested this for the newsletter. I know Mindy also FMQs on a sit down machine like I do and that's why I wrote to her.

I picked up this product at Walmart a few weeks ago and am pretty sure it was less than \$10 on the aisle with quilt sprays, etc. I used it last night on a quilt sandwich for Hartfelt, and then let the quilt rest over night. I always begin sewing the sandwich together with utility stitching in the middle of the quilt working my way out to the sides. I then take it off my machine and check the sandwich to see if there's any part that has shifted or dimpled and needs to be fixed. There usually is something I have to correct at this point. Using FabricFuse, I did not have any of those issues.

When using the product, I put the glue on the fabric, not the batting. I added glue to the quilt top drawing a thin glue line about every 5" to 6" across the width of the quilt. When that side was finished, I flipped the quilt over and did the same to the backing. I have almost finished with the utility stitching, and still nothing has shifted.

This is an e-mail from Patsy Barr:



JULY BOM

Mother's Dream

12" finished

- A) Corner triangles: Cut 2 4" squares, then cut once on the diagonal to get 4 triangles. They are very slightly larger so you can trim.
- B) Side triangles: Cut one square 7 1/4", then cut in an X to get 4 triangles.



C) Two-fabric squares: Cut 4—2 5/8" x 4 3/4" rectangles from 1 fabric AND Cut 4—2 5/8" x 4 3/4" rectangles from <u>another</u> fabric *OR* you could make them as strip sets from two strips 2 5/8" x about 20" long

D) Center square: Cut 1-4 3/4" square

Sew two different C rectangles together to make 4 C/C units that are 4 3/4" squares.

Sew an A corner triangle to one side of each C/C unit.

Sew an A/C unit to two opposites sides of the D center square.

Sew a B triangle to two opposite sides of the A/C unit, matching them at the corner

(right angle)

Complete the block.

Does this seem familiar?

Yes! Our BOM is all based on the Square in a Square family of patterns, so many of the measurements and construction steps are the same. But all the blocks are actually different.

Sometimes people give the patterns different names when they are just made with different placement of values. That is one reason many quilt blocks have several names!
