We have a new charity to support this year. It is the Hart Felt Ministries. I met with them and learned about their mission before the holidays and am very anxious to have them come and share

their story with us. They provide support, volunteers, transportation and much more to our seniors 70 and older. Their goal is to help assist aging in place as long as possible. We will provide 4-5 lap size adult quilts to them quarterly.

During our last donation to Safe Harbor, the director was telling us that just the other day a boy wanted to know if she had a blanket that was softer than the wool blankets they were given to use? We need more quilts for them...approximately 5/5 1/2' x 6/6 1/2'. Please consider showing these young men that you care by making them more comfortable.

QUILTFEST 2020

September 17-19, 2020 "2020 Is Sew Perfect"

At the December 17, 2019, QuiltFest board meeting there was continued discussion on initiatives underway to improve and update QuiltFest.

- Web Redesign
 - The website is being completely reworked to update its appearance and make it more user friendly.
 - o SignUp Genius will be used to assist in volunteer signups. Volunteer jobs will be listed along with available spaces for each two-hour volunteer period. This will help alleviate the problem encountered in past years when there were too many volunteers for some jobs and shortages of volunteers for other jobs. We also will continue to use the paper volunteer form, but guild members will be encouraged to go on line to sign up for volunteer jobs.

- Board Presentations to Guilds
 - o The Board is going to go to each guild belonging to the Seven Sisters Guilds to update the guilds on the status of the QuiltFest. A draft of the presentation was presented to the Board. No dates have been determined for these presentations.
- Expansion Review
 - o The Board continues to explore the addition of categories such as needle arts, fiber arts, doll-making and other non-quilt crafts. It is believed this will help attract artists who are not quilters to the show.
- QuiltFest Board members continue to meet with the management at the Prime Osborn Convention Center to explore possible changes to the floor plan. Some possible changes would include widening of the aisles to reduce congestion (especially in the vendor spaces) and enlarging the space for the Silent Auction.

A check for \$960.10 was presented to the Guild. This is the Guild's share of the proceeds from Quilters Walk.

This next year will be a busy one for the QuiltFest Board as we work to streamline, modernize and improve QuiltFest. The next QuiltFest Board meeting is on Tuesday, January 21, at 7:00 PM at the Lexington Hotel on the Southbank. Guild members are always welcome to attend QuiltFest Board meetings.
