### MINUTES of the NOV. GENERAL MEETING

#### All Star Quilters' Guild General Meeting Minutes November 18th, 2024

President Sherry Verell called the meeting to order at 10:00 A.M.

The Guild presented a check in the amount of \$1,512.00 (the proceeds from the 2024 Raffle Quilt) to Tricha Boleyn from the Child Cancer Fund organization. Sherry asked if there were any corrections or changes to the October General Meeting Minutes, there were none. Linda Harper made a motion to accept the minutes as published, Randy Powers seconded the motion.

Sherry stated that an anonymous donor made a donation towards our January Birthday Party luncheon.

**Vice President** Raney Manning stated that the member's cost for the January Birthday Party luncheon will be \$3.00.

Raney stated that today's program is the Applique Chat with Sunnie Malesky.

**Treasurer** Sharon Tomore gave her Treasurer's Report. The opening balance was \$20,395.26, income totaled \$481.27, expenses totaled \$11,131.55, The closing balance was \$9,744.98. Sharon stated that One to One merged with Vystar.

**Community Service/Free Table** Linda Harper stated that no cards were sent out this month.

Today is the last time that the Free Table will be open this year. It will reopen in February.

**Community Service** Joann Davenport let the members know that we have batting for community service quilts. There are quilt kits available for community service quilts. 25 quilts were donated at Fall Retreat which were given to Hartfelt. Today, \$1,690.00 in groceries and checks were collected for the Mandarin Food Bank.

**Education/Winter Retreat** Ellen Cannon stated that Demo Day is November 25th . Ellen Cannon and Pris Roehm gave details about the Winter Retreat scheduled for February 17th — February 20th . \$50.00 deposit is due next month. There are 5 open spots left.

Jill Kelly passed around sheets asking members to list classes they would like to take and classes that members would like to teach.

**Featured Quilter** Linda Marsh stated that this month's featured quilter is Jenny Chambless.

**Hospitality** Elfriede Echt thanked members who brought goodies today. She also thanked Jean Newton for her help. She passed around the sign-up sheet for Christmas cookies.

**Library/Challenge** Vicki Zoller stated that the library is open today but will be closed in December and January.

The Challenge will be announced in January.

**Membership** Susan Sharpe stated that there are 95 members, one new member and 3 guests present today. She received 75 renewals today. Today's drawing winners are Jody Sciullo and Marsha Bookstaver. Susan thanked members for filling

out the renewal forms.

**Newsletter** Sunnie Malesky stated that the newsletter is on the website. If you are interested in taking over the newsletter, see Sunnie. She has one person interested. **Quilt Mother/UFOs** Mary Anne Dennis stated that she hopes the quilt will be completed sometime in December.

There is one month left for UFOs.

**QOV** Samanth Howell stated that they presented 4 quilts this month. She will be depleting her stock of QOV in December. In January, they will need more quilts.

**Sit 'n Stitch** LeighAnn McGuigan stated that there will be a Sit 'n Stitch on December 9th , 23 rd and 30 th .

**Website** Jenny Chambless asked if anyone has IT experience, please see Jenny. Jenny announced that we now have a private Facebook member only page. There are already 38 members.

**QuiltFest** Pat D'Elia stated that tomorrow is the last QuiltFest meeting for the year. Pat stated that All Stars Quilters' Guild was presented with a check in the amount of \$1,088.00 for the Quilters Walk proceeds. Finances for QuiltFest are not yet finalized but it looks like all seven guilds will receive a check for around \$3,000.00 to be used for education.

Pat had a SUV full of quilts which were donated to the hurricane victims of Burnsville, NC. They were very much appreciated.

**Program** Raney Manning introduced today's program, An Applique Chat with Sunnie Malesky.

**Show 'n Tell** 17 members shared their quilts.

She has been living in Jacksonville for 14 months.

Geri has been quilting for 25 years, and learned to quilt by taking a beginner quilting class from a local shop. Her first quilt was made 50+ years ago for her daughter. She did not make another one for 25 more years. Her first "real" quilt was a fourpatch.

Geri joined All Stars during 2023 by looking for a local guild on line. Geri's favorite things about our guild is Show & Tell, and road trips. In addition to quilting, Geri enjoys gardening, puzzles and needlework.

Geri started making collage dog quilts about five years ago and now works on at least one collage a year. Collages can't be rushed, She purposely lets them sit for months before working on them again and enjoys working with batiks for collage quilts because they don't fray. Geri entered one of her collage dog quilts in QuiltFest last year.

In addition to belonging to All Stars, Geri belongs to a group that meets once a week to quilt at Fort Caroline Christian Church.

Geri is currently working on a collage quilt . . . a flamingo from the Jacksonville Zoo. She took her camera and tripod to the zoo and spent the afternoon photographing the flamingos. She captured different views of this beauty and is enjoying creating him in fabric. She uses a cut and glue method with tulle. She quilts the tulle over the fabric.

Geri was a magazine editor for dollhouse miniatures for 10 years. She is drawn to miniature quilts and small collectibles.

She has three grown daughters and two grandchildren and a miniature dachshund named Abbie.

Something most people don't know about Geri is that she flew in a refueling mission between the Philippines and Okinawa. She was stranded in the Philippines after a shopping trip with a friend, and the refueling mission was the only plane going back to Okinawa, so she took it at 2:00 a.m.


